### REPORT

As part of the school's community outreach program G.D. Goenka Public School, Sarita Vihar works for varied causes concerning the society be it environment poverty, lack of amenities or neglect. As we learnt that millions of children in our country are without a family and a safe home, we reached out to one of the Welfare Homes for Children in our vicinity. **Welfare Home for Children** is affiliated to the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA), Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government of India, to place children in loving homes.

G.D. Goenka Public School, Sarita Vihar in it's endeavor for contributing towards the community, and instilling the values of empathy and compassion organized a field trip to the Welfare Home for Children, taking along volunteers from classes VI and VII. Students were sensitized about the importance of safe shelter, love and care for the young ones, who are deprived of a family due to several reasons. The students were accompanied by two teachers – Ms. Anushree and Ms. Devjani.

Students were encouraged to engage in play and activities with the children to share a loving bond and feeling of family. More importantly, spending time with them, playing with them and showering love that they deserve were driven through this visit.

Students engaged in activities like drawing, story-telling and singing rhymes with them. The founder of this beautiful home, Ms. Achala Khanna conducted the facility tour, showing the well equipped nursery, with all the required medical equipments, classrooms and dormitory for the children. Students' interaction with the elderly left an indelible mark on them, making them more sensitized towards the little ones.

As a reflection on the visit, children wrote slogans on Fairness and Equality, building an understanding on including all strata, caste culture and gender of people in the

mainstream society. The visit helped bring home a perspective of humanity above all for our students, as they realized that small children when born and abandoned find a shelter at this place without being discriminated on the basis of caste, color, creed, ability or gender.
